Educational Program of Tibet World



Tibet World is proud to announce that it is one of the best institutes to learn various languages such as Chinese, English, German, and French. It is very clear from the statistics that every year there is an increase in the number of students. This year 529 students registered at Tibet World to learn various international languages. Tibet world is excelling in giving systematic language courses. We are pleased to tell you all that this year 487 volunteers joined hands with Tibet World and provided their valuable time and energy. Following is the reasons why the Tibet world is the best institute around McLeod Ganj to learn the language.

- 1) Tibet World has regular Chinese and English teachers which help teachers to evaluate student's progress and enhance their language in a progressive manner.
- 2) Tibet World has its own language course book which was prepared by Tibet World's own experienced teachers.
- 3) Tibet World holds meetings regularly to discuss the challenges faced by the teachers and share their experiences.

4) Tibet World's conversation class is conducted two times a day which aims to improve speaking of the respective language. The conversation class has two levels, one is for elementary level students and the other is for intermediate level students. This is mainly to help elementary level students to take part in the conversation class. The topics of the conversation class are prepared weekly in advance.

Tibetan cultural Programs



Tibetan culture: obscured by the shadow of China, Tibetan culture has remained a hidden gem for centuries. Their deep passion for knowledge and talent in the arts remains a mystery for us in the western world. But here at Dharamshala, Tibet is very much alive and Tibet World has been vibrantly preserving Tibetan culture and constantly sharing it with people from all around the world.

The art in Tibetan culture has a unique religious touch and it contains deep meanings that convey core ideas of Buddhist philosophy. This unique Tibetan culture has been passed on from one generation to the next generation. However, on the other hand, the current status of Tibet and Tibetan people highly threaten the very existence of ancient Tibetan culture and tradition. Tibetan culture is on the verge of extinction hence preserving Tibetan art and culture is extremely important and Tibet World puts its best possible efforts into preserving Tibetan culture.

Tibetan Rugs are the main art form and to this day, the ancient traditions are maintained by still doing them by hand. In addition to this, the painting depicting deities, mandalas, famous monks, and other important aspects of Tibetan life is also a key way to pass on knowledge. The paintings are done in cotton or linen and rolled up and a store to ensure the image doesn't fade.

Aside from painting, music and dance are also intertwined with Buddhism. The Music consists of chanting sacred text in Sanskrit or Tibetan. Modern music has also played an important role in the evolution of classical chants to give them a fresh sound. During certain festivals, Tibetan folk opera is performed and well-loved by the community. The “ache Lhamo” is a mix of dance and song that re-enacts ancient Buddhist stories and Tibetan history.

Like any other culture in the world, food plays a key role in maintaining its essence. It shows who they are and where they come from. The food allows us to tell stories without saying a word. You can tell a lot about a country’s landscape, resources, jobs, traditions, and religion by what they eat. Tibet is no exception to this. Since Tibet is quite high up, not a lot of crops can grow so the diet has adapted to fit the needs of the people. Barley is one of the main ingredients in Tibetan cuisine and combines with the traditional butter tea, it is an excellent source of protein and fat that the people need to stand the long distances and the cold. Dharamshala has excellent restaurants and food stands that allow tourists to try the Tibetan cuisine and Tibetans to be left at home with each bite.

Here in the Dharamshala, the Tibetan culture is so well preserved that one would get the real feel of Tibetan culture here at Dharamshala as one would feel in Tibet. Since 1959, when His Holiness the Dalai Lama was forced to flee Tibet, the Tibetan government headquarters have been established here and bringing with them a great influx of music, food, and architecture that truly makes this place feel like “little Lhasa”. Dharamshala has the largest Tibetan population outside its homeland and many organizations work to preserve the traditions and culture. Tibet World is one of a leading organization which is working very hard to achieve this goal of preserving and promoting Tibetan culture. Tibet World has many programs that are innate to Tibetan cultures such as Yoga, Meditation, Workshops on Buddhist Philosophy and many more. Every week you will find yoga and meditation sessions, informative talks about a wide range of subjects, cultural shows, and even documentary screenings.

June 6th World Compassion in Action Day

Introduction to Taiwanese Culture by a group of students from Taiwan (19th and 20th of August 2019)

On the 19th of August, a group of 20 students from Taiwan visited Tibet World sharing their culture and helping our students with the Chinese language. Following are the details of the activities they arranged for our students

Lantern: In Taiwan, they celebrate the lantern festival on January 15th which is also the last day of Chinese New Year. Building a Taiwanese lantern on your own is a really good way to learn about Taiwanese culture. The students from the Pine Tree organization taught how to make a lantern in a very easy manner with paper. They also gave LED lights to be put inside the lantern and use lantern at night.

Spring Couplet: Apart from lantern making, they introduce the concept of Chinese New Year and the origins of spring couplets. The Taiwanese students gave insight into how and what Chinese and Taiwanese do during their New Year. In the end, they taught our students how to make spring couplets by ourselves by teaching calligraphy.

Bamboo gun: During this class, the students introduced some traditional toys that almost every Taiwanese had played with, which are bamboo guns. Bamboo guns are the most popular ones. To make a bamboo gun of your own you just have to prepare some chopsticks and some rubber bands. After making the gun, they held a little shooting contest for the students to get more familiar with our traditional toy.

Our students were very glad to learn a lot about the Taiwanese culture and thanked all the students including the group leaders of the “Pinetree” organization. On the 20th of August Taiwanese students collaborated with our Chinese teacher Ms Sonam Khando la and organized many activities to teach the Chinese language.

These two days cultural introduction of Taiwanese by the Taiwanese student group was really helpful to our students and Tibet World is looking forward to collaborating with the Pine-tree organization in the future.

Folk Show and Yoga at Tibet World

Tibet World held Folk show night every Thursday with the vision of preserving Tibetan culture. The Folk Show was attended by about 30 people on average from around the world. During the Folk Show, the Director Mr Yeshe Lhundup gives a little introduction to the history of Tibet and presented Tibetan folk stories along with the folk dances. At the end of the program, the participants also take part in the Tibetan circle dance (Gor-She). Tibet world is proud of being able to preserve and promote the precious Tibetan culture.

Yoga and Sound Healing

Tibet world is also a Centre where people have the opportunity to undergo spiritual experiences. We have yoga classes every evening from 5:15 – 6:30 pm except on weekends. Anyone interested can always drop in at Tibet World. Sound healing – Have you ever had a sound healing session. If not then Tibet World’s door is always open for you all. You need to make an appointment in advance if you are interested in attending the sound healing session.

Compassion + Wisdom = Happiness workshop is special education and cultural program of Tibet World. Tibet World is very happy to provide this workshop to the Youth International group. The introduction of Tibetan culture and compassion + wisdom = happiness talks were given by founder-director Yeshe Lhundup and the Youth International group was introduced to the functioning of Central Tibetan Administration by having them visit the Tibetan parliament in Exile, Department of Information and international relations, Tibetan museums and Library of Tibetan works and archives.

Cultural Exchange Program with University of Denver (USA) (09 to 20 December 2019)

A group of 17 people including students and professors had collaborated with Tibet World as part of the cultural exchange program. The group has learned many things about Tibetan culture and the political situation of Tibet. The group was taken to the Central Tibetan Administration (Exile Tibetan Government) where they learned how systematically the Tibetan refugee government functions. They also visited the Tibetan Library where they learned about the age-old Tibetan culture; mainly about Buddhist scriptures and statues of gods and goddesses. Among the group, two students, Leah and Colin, volunteered at Tibet World to carry out important projects.



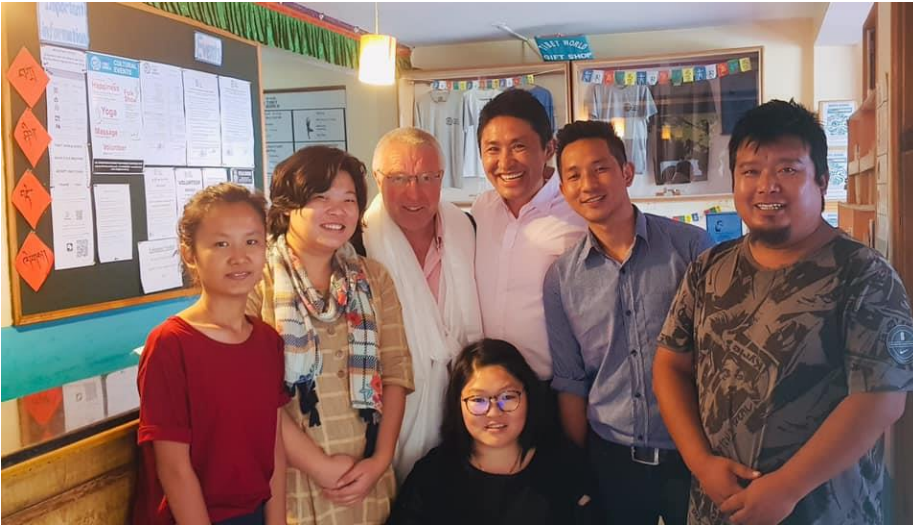


